They all schedule their lives around the ever-growing responsibility of the caregiving role to allow Philip to remain at home and to support one another during family milestones, including their son's wedding in September 2023 and welcoming grandchildren.

Robyn shared recently that it is like a marathon and she is mindful they need to pace themselves. You cannot help but feel their warmth, dedication to each other, and inspiration as you walk in the door of their home. Their strength is shown through their faith and love for each other.

In 2020, the Serez family took part in a documentary to share their story as they navigate this difficult season of their lives. In this, Philip refers to his journey and the "terrible delight of losing everything." The family's resilience and unconditional love radiates when you speak with them, and within this "terrible delight" they have found hope, joy and purpose.
